Preparations are underway for our Presentation Day ceremony. The ceremony will be held under the school COLA, as it was last year.

The following COVID-19 restrictions will apply, so we can run the event:

- Only two people per family will be allowed to attend the ceremony.
 RSVP is compulsory, please call the school by Wednesday 9 December to let us know you will be attending.
- All family members will need to sit together and abide by the seating requirements
- All visitors will need to remain seated for the entire ceremony
- All visitors will be required to complete the External Visitors to the School form upon entry onto the grounds. This will be kept as a record of attendees for COVID-19 tracing. All details will be securely held for 28 days. Parents are requested to arrive 15 minutes prior to the ceremony, so they can be signed in.
- At the conclusion of the ceremony, all visitors are required to leave the school and not stand around socialising.
- If you are unwell, please do not attend the event
- Parents are also reminded they are only allowed to take photos of their own children.

Super Easy Rocky Road

Serves 3

Ingredients

- 4 cups milk chocolate melts
- 80 g Copha
- 3 cups Kellogg's Rice Bubbles
- 100 g mini marshmallows
- 50 g chopped jelly snakes
- 1/2 cup dried apricot (finely chopped)
- hundreds and thousands (*to decorate)

Method:

- 1. Grease a 20cm square cake pan. Line base and sides with baking paper.
- Stir chocolate melts and copha in a large bowl, over a pan of simmering water, until smooth. Remove from heat.
- 3. Stir in remaining ingredients; mix until well combined.
- Spread mixture into prepared pan.
- 5. Sprinkle over hundreds and thousands.
- 6. Refrigerate until firm.
- 7. Cut into squares.
- 8. Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator.

Candy Cane Cheesecake Slice

Serves 3

Ingredients

- 125 g plain sweet biscuits
- 90 g butter
- 375 g cream cheese (room temperature)
- 1/4 cup caster sugar
- 1 teaspoon peppermint extract
- 2 teaspoons gelatine powder
- 2 Tablespoons boiling water
- 180 g white chocolate melts
- 300 ml thickened cream
- 150 g candy canes (crushed)

Method

- 1. Grease and line an 18cm X 28cm rectangular slice tray with baking paper and set aside. Finely crush the plain sweet biscuits in a food processor and place into a bowl. Add the butter and mix together well. Press firmly into the prepared tin and place into the fridge.
- 2. Place the cream cheese, caster sugar and peppermint extract into a large bowl. Beat until smooth and creamy.
- 3. Sprinkle the gelatine powder over the boiled water and stir to dissolve. Once cooled, add the gelatine mixture to the cream cheese and stir through.
- 4. Melt the white chocolate in the microwave on 30 second bursts at 50% power, stirring at each interval, until just melted.
- 5. Add the melted chocolate, whipped cream and crushed candy canes to the cream cheese mixture and fold through.
- 6. Pour into the prepared pan and place into the fridge to set overnight.
- 7. Cut into slices
