EMMAVILLE LITERACY AND NUMERACY



This year NAPLAN tests will occur between Tuesday 10 May and Friday 20 May. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will sit for tests in Reading, Conventions of Language (spelling, grammar and punctuation), Writing and Numeracy. All tests, except Year 3 Writing, will be online.

Last term students sat for practice tests. This allowed them to become familiar with the test conditions, format and range of questions. In addition, class teachers will provide further practice in basic literacy and numeracy.

How can parents help their children prepare for NAPLAN? Here are a few suggestions:

- Support students in their regular schoolwork and homework.
- Encourage children to look forward to NAPLAN and make their very best effort
- Remind them to follow instructions during the test and be sure to answer all questions
- Suggest that students keep a diary or journal at school and home. In this way, writing will become a part
 of their day-to-day lives
- Use family activities, such as shopping, as opportunities to reinforce literacy (reading labels, using the item finder...) and numeracy (comparing cost per 100 grams, converting grams and kilograms...). Going for a family drive provides many practice examples: distance travelled, distance remaining, reading signs, estimating travel time, estimating petrol costs...
