# FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents, Carers, Grandparents and Community Members,

We have had another busy fortnight with students competing in the cross country and completing NAPLAN assessments. Congratulations to all students for their commitment and participation in both these events.

# **Reminder of guidelines for close contacts**

Last month NSW Health announced changes to isolation rules for close contacts which mean that students and staff identified as close contacts and showing no symptoms can return to school with certain requirements.

Close contacts attending school will need to adhere to the following in addition to the NSW Health Guidelines:

They must notify the school and/or early childhood education (ECE) service provider (including their outside of school hours care provider) if they are intending to return under this provision.

They should conduct a daily rapid antigen test (RAT) and return a negative result each morning before attending school for 5 school days.

If in a secondary school setting they must wear a mask indoors except when eating or exercising. Primary school students are recommended to wear a mask indoors (except when eating or exercising).

No student or staff member identified as a close contact will be permitted to participate in overnight excursions, including school camps.

Any visitor to a school site who is a close contact is required to advise the school that they are a close contact before they come on site. These visitors should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result before attending. They must also wear a mask indoors at all times. Schools should consider if the visit can be conducted virtually.

# EMMAVILLE LITERACY AND NUMERACY

# Writing



Do you remember the "Three R's"? These were, of course, Reading, wRiting and aRithmetic. In recent years there has been a return to these basics of literacy and numeracy. The reason is clear; they are the most fundamental tools for learning, as well as being essential for managing in any job, or everyday life for that matter.

There seems little doubt that writing is a concern across Australia, and perhaps the world. It may be that emails and text messaging have reduced the amount of formal writing we experience. Having the ability to write, for instance, an informative and persuasive letter to a member of parliament, government agency or media organisation can be an extremely powerful tool.

Here is what the NSW Department of Education emphasises when students are writing:

- understand the sense of audience and the engagement of the reader as they write.
- understand and use specific text features of, for example, a persuasive argument or narrative.
- organise the text in a meaningful way using a variety of sentence structures, appropriate sequencing and text connectives to control the text.
- use typical grammatical features to meet the purpose of the writing.
- use a range of language devices and precise vocabulary.
- spell and punctuate.

With a bit of practice, our children may even be able to produce a letter to the editor as witty as the following: Dear Sir/Madam I think that our star, The Sun, is highly overrated. At least The Moon gives a little light off at night. The Sun only shines in the daytime when it's light anyway.
