SECONDARY NEWS

Secondary Maths

Our secondary maths teacher, Mr Glennan has received a transfer and will complete his time teaching at Emmaville Central School at the end of this term. We are currently working to fill the maths teacher position, but we are unsure of how long it may take. To ensure continuity in their learning, students in Years 11 and 12 will be enrolled in distance education for Maths, studying via an online portal, using technology to engage with their distance education teacher. They will also have a teacher at ECS to supervise and support them during their lessons. Years 7-10 will be allocated a teacher for Maths. Please contact the school if you have further questions.

Personalised Learning Pathways

What are Personalised Learning Pathways? Personalised Learning Pathways are an active process. They are developed in a consultation process between the student, parents/carers and teachers, to identify, organise and apply personal approaches to learning and engagement. Personalised Learning Pathways can have short term or long-term goals. Short term goals can be specific stepping stones to reach long term goals. Who are they for? It is recommended that all Aboriginal students have a PLP that is tailored to the student and is regularly reviewed and updated to meet student needs.

Merit system

Students have been achieving well and many have received merit awards already, so this is an excellent opportunity to remind students and their families about our positive rewards system for students. Merit cards are linked to the school reward levels of:

Silver (15 merit cards) - A certificate and a book voucher.

Imogen 'The lynx is more than twice the size of a house cat.'


Peter 'A howler monkey can be heard up to 3 miles away'
