It's been great to have our students back in classrooms and settling into the new school term.



Welcome back for our final term of the 2024 school year. Our HSC students have made a positive start to their formal HSC Examinations, having already completed their English and CAFS and Mathematics exams. They have several more in coming weeks, which we wish them well for.

#### **Merit System**

It is wonderful to see that many of our students have been recognised for achieving Bronze, Silver, Gold and Diamond Awards already this year. I encourage students to continue to strive to their full potential in every aspect of their education (academic, vocational, sport, and social development) to be recognised with merit awards, and in turn, special awards and rewards.

#### **TAFE - Start Your Future**

This week some of our Stage 5 students commence the TAFE- Start Your Future program which is designed to get students into a TAFE-style learning setting and exposes them to vocational education in an area they are considering for future study and/or work. This will involve participating students attending TAFE (Glen Innes campus) one day per week over a number of weeks to study hospitality or engineering. What a great opportunity!

#### The Resilience Project (TRP)

All students continue to develop their resilience and wellbeing by focusing on gratitude, empathy and mindfulness as part of our partnership with The Resilience Project. Recently, students have explored gratitude by showing appreciation for things they have in their lives that can sometimes be taken for granted.

Practising gratitude is the ability to notice things in your life and around you (big and small) and appreciate them, rather than thinking about the things you wish you had, or might be missing out on. Making this a daily habit rewires your brain to scan the world for the positives rather than default to our negative bias. Over time, this leads to increased levels of energy, happiness, and self-esteem.

Why not try practicing gratitude at home as a family?

#### WHAT TO DO:

- Get together as a family. This may be after dinner or just sitting together in the living room.
- Create a family conversation dice (image attached) to use as a game whenever you like, or at the dinner table at night.
- Cut out the dice template over the page and follow the instructions to create the dice.
- You can decorate the dice before cutting it out.
- Each member of the family takes turns to roll the dice and answers the questions that appear.
- You can make your own family conversation questions if you prefer.
